<p>Early Help for Families</p>	<p>What is early help in Barnsley?</p> <p>Early help is our approach to providing support to potentially vulnerable children, young people and families as soon as problems start to emerge, or where there is a strong likelihood that problems will emerge in the future. Early help may occur at any point in a child or young person's life, from childhood to adolescence and includes both interventions early in life as well as interventions early in the development of a problem. It is about the way we can all work together, share information, and put the child and their family at the centre, providing effective support to help them solve problems and find solutions at an early stage, at the point that the needs first emerge so we avoid needs becoming so great that specialist statutory interventions are required.</p>	<p>Phone: 0800 0345 340</p>
